Section 1018 of Public Law 116-315, Johnny Isakson and David P. Roe, M.D. Veterans Health Care and Benefits Improvement Act of 2020, requires educational institutions to make certain disclosures to students using federal military and/or VA education benefits. Enrollment Certification

Certification for VA Education Benefits each semester is automatic. Students who *do not wish* to receive the benefit must let our VA Certifying Official know that they do not wish to use their GI Bill benefits for a particular semester no later than *one month* prior to the start of a new semester.

Absence due to Military Service

A student who is placed on active duty for 14 calendar days or more will be placed on a military LOA. Students, or an appropriate officer of the armed forces or official of the Department of Defense, must submit documentation/orders regarding the return to active duty to the Office of the Registrar. Students placed on active duty military LOA will receive a grade of "W" and a full refund for all courses in which they are currently enrolled.

When the student is ready to return from leave, the student must contact the Office of the Registrar to arrange for re-entry. The student is eligible for reinstatement to the college without re-qualification for admission if the student:

- Provides a letter of intent to return to the institution no later than three (3) years after the completion of the period of service, and
- Returns to the college after a cumulative absence of not more than five (5) years.

Prior to reinstatement into the program of study, the student must meet with the program coordinator to determine the impact of their absence, their ability to resume study, and placement into the program. The student may be required to demonstrate clinical competency prior to returning to the program. If the student is required to repeat courses previously taken, there will be no tuition charged for those courses.
